




BACK TO THE FUTURE: AI AND THE USE OF TECHNOLOGY IN INTERNATIONAL ARBITRATION

"Wait a minute, Doc. Are you telling me you built a time machine... out of a DeLorean?"



We encourage everybody to activate their video and to enter the break-out room with a coffee/tea/whatever they like in their hand to enjoy this easy-going atmosphere!


Add an additional flavour to your favourite drink by choosing which virtual coffee break you want to experience! The participants who register by 13 November can choose between the two different break-out rooms:


